only the best edition yet, but also

details of more than a 1000 pubs (all known real ale outlets in the County) crammed into its '72 pages, yet manages to retain a clarity which will be the envy of many less-crowded guides. A handy innovation is the inclusion of a key to pub facilities printed at the foot of each pair of pages. In addition to a map of Hampshire, this year's guide also has plans of the County's larger towns and cities, with each real ale pub overprinted in red, with a reference number to guide you to the pub's entry in the text. Comparison with previous editions shows the continuing success of traditional beer in this area: for instance Aldershot's entry has increased from 5 pubs to 18 (although one of these, the Unicorn, has recently had its handpumps removed by Courages after many years as the town's only Gales outlet). Farnborough can boast 13 entries, Cove 7, Crookham 6, Alton 13 and 10 in Blackwater and Yateley. Dozens of other real ale pubs can be found in the villages in our part of the county.

REAL ALE IN HAMPSHIRE 1981-2 can be obtained, price £1 from some pubs and bookshops in the area, or from CAMRA meetings (only 70p to members). If you have difficulty in obtaining a copy, send a cheque/P.O. (payable to CAMRA Surrey/Hants Borders) for £1 plus a 9"x5" 20p stamped envelope to Roland Edwards, 3 Wren Close, Alton, Hants.

SEPTEMBER 26th is the date to note in your diaries. CAMRA's first "Alton Harvest Beer Festival" takes place that evening at the Assembly Rooms, from 6 until 11pm.

A wide variety of beers will be available, including local favourites such as King and Barnes, rarities such as Holdens, Bathams and Simpkiss, and others not normally avail -able in the area, such as Burt's beers from the Isle of Wight.

Snacks will be available, and the £1.50 admission includes entertainment and a souvenir glass.

Tickets are available from pubs in the Alton area, and from the Sandrock in Farnham. A form for postal applications can be found on page 3 of this issue.

A particularly sad loss from the GBG will be the Hen & Chicken at Froyle. The pub still serves first-rate beer (currently including "Hen & Chicken Special" brewed by Ringwood), but its enthusiastic manager is planning to move on soon, so his replacement must also prove his ability to serve beer in tip-top condition before the pub can again be listed in the Good Beer Guide.

THE LYGON ARMS, CHIPPING CAMPDEN, GLOUCESTERSHIRE

I can recommend a trip to investigate the charms of Chipping Campden, including in particular the Lygon Arms, which is a free house serving, amongst others, Hook Norton bitter, Wadworth's 6X, Marston's Pedigree and Merrie Monk, all in superb condition. You can stay on the premises for Bed & Breakfast (huge!) and use it as a base for forays into the immediate area - I cannot praise the Davenports at the Fox too highly. For the waking hours between pints there is a fine collection of vintage cars in the village, featuring Jaguars especially, together with the folk museum in the Staple Hall.

TRIP TO SALISBURY - October 17th.

Due to the high cost of coach hire, we have chosen Salisbury as the venue for this year's CAMRA Autumn outing, as this beautiful city can be reached very easily from all parts of the branch by train. Apart from the 13th Century cathedral and many other historic buildings, you may find some of the city's 39 real ale pubs of interest! One pub, the Haunch of Venison, is a must for lovers of quaint old inns, especially the not too squeamish! Quite a few beers are available, and there is even a Gibbs pub, serving Premium and Bishop's Tipple, right outside the station, which should make the wait for a home-bound train easily bearable. We shall travel to Salisbury on the 1038 departure from Woking (connections from Alton, Farnham, Aldershot, Ash Vale, Brookwood, Haslemere, Milford, Godalming, Guildford, Worplesdon, West Byfleet, etc.), which also calls at Basingstoke at 1100 (connections from Farnborough, Fleet, Winchfield and Hook) on Saturday, October 17th.
